



CONTINUING EDUCATION

The Indian Health Service (IHS) Clinical Support Center is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education to sponsor continuing medical education for physicians.

The IHS Clinical Support Center designates this continuing education activity for up to 14 3/4 hours of Category I credit toward the Physician's Recognition Award of the American Medical Association. Each physician should claim only those hours of credit he or she actually spent in the education activity.

The American Academy of Physician Assistants (AAPA) accepts this AMA Category I credit for physician assistants.

The Indian Health Service is accredited as a provider of continuing education in nursing by the American Nurses Credentialing Center Commission on Accreditation, and designates this program for 17.7 contact hours for nurses.
