The Committee recommends a rescission of \$161,000, the same as the budget request and the House allowance pursuant to section 2901 of the Deficit Reduction Act of 1984.

The Committee understands that approximately \$200,000 of Housing Improvement Program funds will be used in the current year to provide bathrooms to homes on the Turtle Mountain Reservation and that some additional funds will be used in fiscal year 1986 to complete the renovation project. In accordance with the agreement between the Bureau of Indian Affairs and the Indian Health Service, it is expected that IHS will make the necessary funds available to connect these homes to the rural water system.
