

Welcome to KIC Tribal Health Clinic

Mission Statement

The KIC Tribal Health Clinic in partnership with our patients and with respect for Native culture will provide high quality professional services to promote and improve the health of Alaska Natives and American Indians.

Through our medical, dental, mental health, pharmacy and contract health services, KICTHC seeks to improve the health status of its beneficiaries to the highest level possible.

The KICTHC is an AAAHC accredited outpatient facility with the following departments:

Medical:

Four physicians and two Family Nurse Practitioners. We offer a full range inpatient and outpatient family practice services except obstetrics. KICTHC is also equipped to perform colonoscopies, colposcopies as well as echocardiograms, treadmill testing, casting, suturing and more. We provide inpatient care at Ketchikan General Hospital, an excellent medical facility next door to the KIC Clinic.

Social Services:

This department includes medical social work, substance abuse programs and domestic violence services.

Dental:

Three dentists, two dental hygienists and five certified dental assistants. We provide root canal surgery, minor oral surgery, routine fillings as well as preventive dental care. Fee for service care includes: dentures, partials, crowns, bridges and orthodontics.

Pharmacy:

Three pharmacists and one pharmacy technician. We provide drug information, patient counseling, an anti-coagulation clinic and chemo therapy infusions.

The KIC Tribal Health Clinic offers a competitive salary to potential candidates for staff physician positions and a generous benefit package that includes continuing medical education (CME), malpractice insurance coverage, retirement insurance, annual/sick leave and more. We are also a federally designated loan repayment site.
