

DUTIES: The incumbent works with the Public Health Director, Director of Public Health Nursing, Community Nutrition Coordinator, Native Medicine Coordinator, and other key members of the Division of Public Health, fully participates in management, strategic planning and policy decisions and shares accordingly in implementing plans. Participates with the Public Health Director and staff members in the formulation of policies, procedures and programs. Serves as a voting member of the Public Health Executive Committee. Works to promote an understanding of Service Unit public health programs. The incumbent is responsible for the operations of the Health Promotion Department, including programmatic, financial and personnel administration and management. Assures that personnel requirements are met. Promotes staff recruitment, retention and satisfaction through effective communications, staff recognition and proactive public health workforce development activities. Manages the departmental finances. Regularly assesses departmental staffing, equipment and other resources needed to meet program goals. Continually assesses program operations and implements changes. The incumbent is responsible for CSU health promotion program development, management and evaluation and departmental quality management in order to continuously improve quality, access and effectiveness of community-base health promotion services and further the service unit strategic plan. Develops and implements Health Promotion Department Quality Management Plan per CSU policy. Monitors community health promotion needs and priorities and assists communities with identifying and interpreting health information and data. Assures health promotion interventions and services. Develops partnerships to maximize sharing of resources in order to address service unit goals and community health priorities. Serves as a liaison on health promotion-related issues to other agencies and programs providing services. Provides oversight, direction and coordination for research projects and investigations related to health promotion services. Provides consultation and technical assistance to professional staff to ensure optimal use of resources, standardization and validity of data. Performs other related duties as assigned.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS: Degree: major study in an academic field related to the health sciences or allied sciences appropriate to the work of the position

IN ADDITION TO BASIC REQUIREMENTS: Candidates must have had 52 weeks of specialized experience equivalent to at least the GS-11 level to qualify for the GS-12 grade level.

SPECIALIZED EXPERIENCE: Experience that equipped the applicant with the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform successfully the duties of the position, and that is typically in or related to the work of the position to be filled. Examples of the type of experience that will be credited are: administering, managing and coordinating the Health Promotion Program.. This would include such things as planning, implementation, and evaluation of the community based health promotion services.

SUBSTITUTION OF EDUCATION FOR EXPERIENCE: Completion of graduate level education, in addition to meeting the basic requirements. This education must have been obtained in an accredited college or university.

TIME-IN-GRADE REQUIREMENTS: Candidates applying under the provisions of the Merit Promotion Plan must have completed 52 weeks of specialized experience at the GS-11 to qualify for the GS-12 grade level.

SUPERVISORY OR MANAGERIAL ABILITIES: Candidates must have demonstrated in their work experience or training that they possess, or have the potential to develop, the qualities of successful supervision, as listed under the appropriate category below:

- a. Ability to motivate, train and works effectively with subordinates who have a variety of background and training.
- b. Ability to accomplish the quality and quantity of work expected within set limits of cost and time.
- c. Ability to plan own work and carry out assignments effectively.
- d. Ability to communicate with others effectively, both orally and in writing, in working out solutions to problems or questions related to work.
- e. Ability to understand and further manage goals as these affect day-to-day work operations.
- f. Ability to develop improvements in or design new work methods and procedures.

CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT: Immunization requirements- All persons born after 12-31-56 must provide proof of immunity to Rubella and Measles. Serology testing to confirm immunity and/or immunization will be provided free of charge. Special consideration may be allowed to individuals who are allergic to a component of a vaccine, have a history of severe reaction to a vaccine, or who are currently pregnant. This applies to candidates for positions in any Service Unit or any Area Office position that requires regular work at a Service Unit.

WHO MAY APPLY:

MERIT PROMOTION PLAN (MPP) CANDIDATES: Applications will be accepted from status eligible (e.g., reinstatement eligible and current permanent employees in the competitive Federal service) and from current permanent IHS employees in the Excepted Service who are entitled to Indian Preference.

EXCEPTED SERVICE EXAMINING PLAN (ESEP) CANDIDATES: Applications will be accepted from individuals entitled to Indian Preference. Current permanent IHS Excepted Service employees and Competitive Service employees or Reinstatement eligible entitled to Indian Preference may also apply under the provisions of the Indian Health Service Examining Plan. These candidates

MUST indicate on their resumes or, application, whether their resume or application is submitted under the IHS Excepted Service Examining Plan, the IHS Area Merit Promotion Plan or both.

Applications will also be accepted from individuals eligible for non-competitive appointment (e.g., applicants eligible for appointment under the Veterans Readjustment Act, the severely handicapped, those with a 30% or more compensable service-connected disability).

VETERANS: Veterans who are preference eligibles or who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 years of more of continuous active service may apply.

INFORMATION FOR DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES (DHHS) SURPLUS OR DISPLACED EMPLOYEES REQUESTING SPECIAL SELECTION PRIORITY CONSIDERATION.

If you are currently a DHHS employee who has received a Reduction in Force (RIF) separation notice or a certificate of expected separation, you may be entitled to special priority selection under the DHHS Career Transition Assistance Program (CTAP). To receive this priority consideration you must:

1. Be a current DHHS career or career-conditional (tenure group I or II) or be a current IHS excepted appointment (with no time limits) tenure group II excepted/competitive service employee who has received a RIF separation notice or a Certificate of Excepted Separation (CES) and, the date of the RIF separation has not passed and you are still on the rolls of DHHS. You must submit a copy of the RIF separation notice or CES along with your application.
2. Be applying for a position that is at or below the grade level of the position from which you are being separated. The position must not have a greater promotion potential than the position from which you are being separated.
3. Have a current (or last) performance rating of record of at least fully successful or equivalent. This must be submitted with your application package.
4. Be currently employed by DHHS in the same commuting area of the position for which you are requesting priority consideration.
5. File your application by the vacancy announcement closing date and meet all the application criteria (e.g., submit all required documentation, etc.)
6. Meets the basic qualification for the position any documented selective factor, physical requirements with any reasonable accommodation and is able to satisfactorily perform the duties of the position without undue interruption.

INFORMATION FOR DISPLACED EMPLOYEES REQUESTING SPECIAL SELECTION PRIORITY CONSIDERATION UNDER THE INTERAGENCY CAREER TRANSITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ICTAP).

If you are a displaced Federal employee you may be entitled to receive special priority consideration under the ICTAP. To receive this priority consideration, you must:

1. Be a displaced Federal employee. You must submit a copy of the appropriate documentation such as RIF separation notice, a letter from OPM or your agency documenting your priority consideration status with your application package. The following categories of candidates are considered employees.
 - A. Current or former career or career-conditional (tenure group I or II) competitive service employees who:
 1. Received a specific RIF separation notice; or
 2. Separated because of a compensable injury, whose compensation has been terminated, and whose former agency certifies it is unable to place; or
 3. Retired with a disability and whose disability annuity has been or is being terminated; or
 4. Upon receipt of a RIF separation notice retired on the effective date of the RIF and submits a Standard Form 50 that indicates "Retirement in lieu of RIF"; or
 5. Retired under the discontinued service retirement option; or
 6. Was separated because he/she declined a transfer of function or directed reassignment to another community area.

OR

- B. Former Military Reserve or National Guard Technician who are receiving a special Office of Personnel Management (OPM) disability retirement annuity under section 8337(h) or 8456 of Title 5 United States Code.
2. Be applying for a position at or below the grade level of the position from which you have been separated. The position must not have greater promotion potential than the position from which you were separated.
3. Have a current (or last) performance rating of record of at least fully successful or equivalent. This must be submitted with your application package. (This requirement does not apply to candidates who are eligible due to compensable injury or disability retirement).
4. Occupy or be displaced from a position in the same local commuting area of the position for which you are requesting priority

consideration.

5. File your application by the vacancy announcement closing date and meet all the application criteria (e.g., submit all required documentation, etc.).
6. Be rated well qualified by achieving a score of 80 on a rating scale of 70 to 100 for the position including documented selective factors, quality ranking factor, physical requirements with reasonable accommodations and is able to satisfactorily perform the duties of the position upon entry.

EVALUATION CRITERIA: Evaluation will be made of Experience, Performance Appraisal, Training, Letters of Commendation, Self-Development, Awards and Outside Activities that are related to the position. To receive full credit for your qualifications, provide a narrative statement that fully describes all aspects of your background as they relate to the knowledge, skills, and abilities (KSA's) outlined below and show the level of accomplishment and degree of responsibility.

The KSA's in your narrative statement will be the principle basis for whether or not you are highly qualified for the position. Describe your qualifications in each of the following:

A copy of an Official Bureau of Indian Affairs Preference Certificate, BIA Form 4432, signed by the appropriate BIA Official, must be submitted if the applicant claims Indian Preference. Navajo Area Indian Health Service employees claiming Indian Preference need not submit the BIA Form 4432, but MUST state that such documentation is contained in their Official Personnel Folder.

ADDITIONAL SELECTIONS: Additional or alternate selections may be made within 90 days of the date of the certificate issued if the position becomes vacant or to fill an identical additional position in the same geographic location.

COMMISSIONED OFFICER: Commissioned Officers applicants claiming Indian Preference will be evaluated by the Area Personnel Office against the applicable Preston standard; or the civil service standard, if no Preston standard exists. These applicants must describe the experience gained in their two most recent positions and provide the dates they occupied those positions. In addition, commissioned Corps Indian Preference applicant must also provide information regarding education, including degrees obtained and schools attended and they must include home/work telephone numbers if this information is not contained in the resumes. When required by the vacancy announcement, these knowledge, skills and abilities that are being used as selective factors. Commissioned Corps Indian Preference applicants may also be required to submit proof of Indian Preference and proof of possession of the appropriate license.
