GENERAL FUNCTION: Provide assessments, group, family, and individual counseling, crisis response, and treatment for clients and their family members.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Perform comprehensive intake evaluations of patients' mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual needs.
- Complete psychosocial histories including substance use history.
- Develop and conduct individualized treatment plans.
- Counseling patients primarily in the office with some community outreach, as needed.
- Willingness to document client contacts electronically.
- Demonstrates a thorough working knowledge of the DSM-IV mental and substance use diagnoses.
- Provides ongoing direct billable services to children and adult clients.
- Establish and maintain patient case files ensuring current quality standards as required by WAC, CARF, IHS, county and other contracts.
- Develop and conduct focused group sessions and community-based prevention presentations.
- Coordinate with other PTHA staff in providing multi-disciplinary approach to treatment.
- Assist in training and educating staff and community.
- Other duties as assigned.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE): Masters Degree in Human Services related field, plus two (2) years experience in the behavioral health field. Current WA state license as a Mental Health Counselor, Social Worker, or Marriage & Family Therapist required. Counselor Registration does not qualify for meeting minimum job requirements. Must have current CPR and First Aid certification.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES: Demonstrates cultural competencies, customs and traditions in working with the Native population. Knowledge of the principles and practices of clinical psychology and counseling techniques. Knowledge of current social and health problems related to psychological disorders.

Knowledge of community resources and referral agencies. Knowledge of group dynamics. Able to evaluate, diagnose, and treat patients. Good organization and time management skills. Current, valid Washington state driver's license. Work experience with Native Americans preferred.

AGE SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES: Must be able to demonstrate knowledge, skill, and ability necessary to provide care to specific age groups served in his/her assigned area.

INFECTION CONTROL RESPONSIBILITIES: Follow facility policies and attend in-services as appropriate.

SAFETY RESPONSIBILITIES: Follow facility policies and attend in-services as appropriate.
