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**JOB DESCRIPTION:** Serves as the Director of Behavior Health Services for the Fort Yuma Service Unit and is responsible for the operational, procedural and logistical integrity of the department. Directly supervises the administrative and support staff within the department. Will provide clinical consultative, evaluative and psychotherapeutic services including adult, child and adolescent evaluation, diagnosis and treatment of patient, consultative evaluations and recommendations regarding patient care and treatment plans. Provides a full range of psychological services including evaluation, diagnosis, consultation, referral, psychotherapy, crisis intervention, and specialized treatment modalities for children/adolescents and their families. Performs other duties as assigned.

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**WHO MAY APPLY:** Excepted Service, Merit Promotion, and PHS Officers. U.S. citizenship is required.

- Excepted Service Examining Plan Candidates (ESEP) – Individuals entitled to Indian Preference who wish to be considered for excepted appointment in IHS, under authority of 5 CFR, Part 213, Schedule A 213.3116(B)(8).
- Merit Promotion Plan Candidates (MPP) – Current permanent competitive Federal status employees, reinstatement eligible, and current IHS Indian Preference individuals and/or individuals who are eligible for excepted appointment in IHS under some other authority (e.g., handicapped authority, etc).
- PHS Commissioned Corps Officers – Current active or inactive Commissioned Officers may apply.
- Veteran’s Preference - Preference eligible veterans who have been separated from the armed forces under honorable conditions after 3 years or more of continuous active service may apply.

**Indian Preference applicants must indicate on their applications whether they are applying under the MPP, ESEP, or both. If not indicated, they will be considered under the MPP.**

Qualified disabled applicants (Rehabilitation Act of 1973) and disabled veterans with 30% or more disability are encouraged to apply. Reasonable accommodations will be made for qualified applicants with disabilities, except when doing so would impose undue hardship on the Indian Health Service.

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**CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT:**

1. Selectee(s) are required to be immunized against Measles and Rubella and provide documentation prior to or at the time of their start date. Special consideration may be allowed to individuals who are allergic to a component of the vaccine or are currently pregnant. Selectee must have documented immunity to Rubella and Measles.
  2. Selectee(s) are required to complete Security questionnaire and fingerprint chart for investigative purposes under PL 101-630 Indian Child Protection and Family Violence Prevention Act. Persons, who have been arrested for or charged with a crime involving a child, or violent crime against a person, are not eligible for employment with IHS under PL 101-630.
  3. Selectee(s) are required to complete a “Declaration of Federal Employment – Optional Form 306” to determine your suitability for Federal Employment, and to certify the accuracy of all the information in your application. Persons making false statements in any part of the application may not be hired; or fired after employment starts; or may be fined.
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4. Males born after December 31, 1959 are required to be registered with the Selective Service System in order to be eligible for employment with the Federal Government.
5. Selectee(s) are required to have a viable bank account at a financial institution for electronic direct deposit of salary payment.
6. Some service units operate under extended service hours 7 days per week.
7. The incumbent may be required to travel and must possess a valid driver's license.

**QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:** Applicants must be able to perform the tasks of the position. Rating will be based on the following elements:

**Basic Requirements:** Satisfactory completion of all the requirements for the doctoral degree (Ph.D. or equivalent) directly related to full professional work in clinical psychology is required.

**Specialized Experience:** Professional knowledge of psychological principles, theories, methods and data, and the ability to provide effective direct psychological assessment and psychotherapy with a variety of mental health and substance abuse problems with individual adolescents, groups and families; knowledge of the range of intervention strategies, including detoxification and self-help groups; and knowledge of residential and hospital based treatment of substance abuse and mental health problems including staff, client, family and community issues that arise in these facilities and the ability to address them.

**Selective Placement Factor:** Each PHS Clinical Psychologist must possess and maintain a valid current, unrestricted license or certification in a US State.

**Your description of work experience, level of responsibility, and accomplishments will be used to determine that you meet these requirements.**

**Supervisory or Managerial Abilities:** Candidates must have demonstrated in their work experience or training that they possess, or have the potential to develop, the qualities of successful supervision, as listed below:

- Plan and adjust work operations to meet emergency or changing program or emergency program or production requirements within available resources and with minimum sacrifice of quantity or quality of work.
- Establish program objectives or performance goals and assess progress toward their achievement.
- Coordinate and integrate the work activities and resources of several organizational segments or of several different projects.
- Analyze organizational and operational problems and develop timely and economical solutions.
- Represent the activity both within and outside the organization or agency to gain support for the agency's program goals.

**Personal Attributes:** Candidates for all supervisory/managerial positions must demonstrate all of the following personal qualities:

- Objectivity and fairness in judging people on their ability, and situations on the facts and circumstances;
- Capacity to adjust to change, work pressures, or difficult situations without undue stress;
- Willingness to consider new ideas or divergent points of view;
- Capacity to "see the job through;"

**TIME IN GRADE:** Candidates must have completed at least one year of service in a position no more than one grade lower than the position to be filled. (If selected under the Excepted Service Examining Plan, such individuals may be appointed under Schedule A

You may be eligible for special selection priority consideration under the Career Transition Assistant Program (CTAP) if you are a current career or career-conditional (tenure group I or II) employee of the DHHS Agency at the GS-15 grade level or below or equivalent, and who has received a specific RIF separation notice or a Certificate of Expected Separation indication your job is surplus, or notice of removal for declining a directed reassignment or transfer of function outside the local commuting area. To qualify for special selection priority consideration under CTAP you MUST also meet the criteria shown in paragraph 3 below.
2. You may be eligible for special selection priority consideration under the Interagency Career Transition Assistance Program (ICTAP) if you are a current or former career-conditional (tenure group I or II) employee of any agency in the competitive service at the GS-15 grade level or below or equivalent, who has received a specific RIF separation notice or a notice of proposed removal for declining a directed reassignment or transfer of function outside the local commuting area. You may also be eligible if you were separated because of a compensable injury and your compensation has been terminated; or you retired with a disability and your disability annuity has been or is being terminated; or you were in receipt of a RIF separation notice and retired on the effective date of the RIF or under discontinued service; or you are a former Military Reserve Technician or National Guard Technician who is receiving a special disability retirement annuity from OPM. To qualify for special selection priority consideration under ICTAP you MUST also meet the criteria shown in paragraph 3 below.
3. To qualify for special selection priority consideration under CTAP or ICTAP for this vacancy, you MUST also meet ALL of the following:
  - (a) Have a current or last performance rating of record of at least fully successful or equivalent. A copy MUST be submitted with your application package. (Note: this requirement does not apply to candidates who are eligible due to compensable injury or disability retirement).
  - (b) Be applying for a position at or below the grade level from which you will be, or have been separated, and which does not have a greater promotion potential than the position from which you will be, or have been separated.
