


TRANSAM HISTORY AND RECOGNITION

The National Defense Authorization Act of 1995, Section 8032 of Public Law 103-335, created the opportunity for Project TransAm.

The two individuals who spearheaded the legislation were Senators Daniel Inouye of Hawaii and Ted Stevens of Alaska. The senators regard the project as an opportunity to point out important domestic needs and the enhancement of military readiness.

Project TransAm is a Civilian-Military Cooperative Action Program between the Indian Health Service (IHS) and the Department of Defense (DoD) concerning distribution of medical equipment and supplies obtained from closure of military bases and installations.

The National Performance Review (NPR) chose the Project TransAm Team as a recipient of a 1998 "Hammer Award." The Hammer Award, initiated by Vice President Gore, honors federal teams that have made extraordinary progress in reinventing government.

TransAm Timeline

- 1995: Project TransAm Created
 - 1996-1999: \$6 Million in Equipment & Supplies Transferred to 126 Native American Facilities
 - 2000: Project TransAm Relocates from Shaw AFB, TX to Grissom ARB, IN
 - 2003: Refurbished Ambulance Program Begins with Eight Ambulances Being Transferred to Tribal Communities
 - 2006: Chippewa Health Center Destroyed by Fire; Project TransAm Provides Replacement Equipment & Supplies Within 48 Hours
 - 2007: \$1,000,000 Worth of Construction Equipment Transferred to Washoe Tribe for Sanitation Projects
 - 2008: Project TransAm Acquires Military Spec Climate Controlled Tents for Emergency Management Use
 - 2009:
 - Project TransAm Becomes Independent of Department of Defense
 - Project TransAm Acquires "Water Generating Trailer" for Poarch Creek Indians - Trailer Deployed to Haiti for Earthquake Relief
 - 2010: Project TransAm Acquires Mobile Command Center for Use by the Nashville Area Emergency Management Division
 - 2011: Project TransAm Acquires Mobile Health Clinic for Poarch Creek Indians - Mobile Clinic Deployed for Alabama Tornado Relief
- 2003 - 2010: 67 Refurbished Ambulances Provided to Tribal EMS Programs Nationwide**
