To carry and understand the message of happy & safe families we must work together in all aspects of a families life: Education, TANF, Behavioral Health, Housing to mention a few.

NAFFA Fatherhood Programs



- To date 87 tribes/9 Urban Centers/
4 Non-Native Agencies
- Over 8,000 men & women
- Incarcerated fathers & mothers
- Youngest Father 13 years old
- Oldest Father 74 years old

Many programs focus on the needs of women & children.

Little attention is paid to the unique needs of men as they struggle to become valuable family participants

Today, Native American men are often viewed as the cause of many family and social problems.

NAFFA takes the position that fathers are:

- ❖ The solution to address problems
- ❖ The greatest untapped resource available to communities
- ❖ Fathers must take the lead in keeping families together

Family

- Family is at the heart of Native American culture
- There is no other work more important than fatherhood and motherhood

Our greatest happiness & greatest sorrows come from our relationships with our family

Cultural Model

1. Truly love the people whom you serve
2. Love what you bring to the people

*This is essential in strengthening
the desire for positive change*

How is real change achieved?

- Real and lasting change must come from within
- Outside pressure rarely brings lasting change
Example: Knowledge, Preaching, Intimidation
- Change comes by filling life with:

Hope, gratitude, & confidence has powerful
affect on changing attitude and behavior

There is no better way

Our Method Is

- ***Uplifting:*** one's spirit, attitude, self-image, self-worth, feeling welcome, wanted, needed and special
- ***Encouraging:*** strengthening hope, bring new hope, inspire a desire for change, confidence and trust in self and others

- ***Assisting:*** with recognizing opportunities, identifying resources, improving life skills and problem solving abilities
- ***Teaching:*** principles, responsibilities toward family, fatherhood, motherhood, marriage, and self-control

NAFFA's Position in Serving

Majority of people are not sick or ill!

- They have been:
 - Misled
 - Misguided
 - Misdirected
 - Misinformed
- Learned a lot of **bad habits**.
- Not right or wrong; good or bad; **HAVE BEEN FOOLED**.

Bringing Positive Change

We must be

- Forward thinking
- Forward looking
- Forward moving people

To honor the past, we must improve upon the present.

This is accomplished through strong fathers and mothers who are devoted to their families.

- Over 600 tribes in United States
- On and off reservations
- Wide age span, part native
- Diverse family dynamics (stepchildren, adoption, single parent, etc.)

Leadership

Every institution must have a leader.

The family is no different.

Fatherhood is Leadership— The most important kind of leadership.


- Leadership does not mean that the father is the boss, in charge, or is more important
- Fathers, lead your families with love, kindness, and gratitude
- Parenting is a full and equal partnership

If fatherhood is leadership & the purpose of life is to have happy & safe families:

- It is the father's responsibility is to bring happiness & safety to his family.
- A good starting point is to bring happiness and safety to his wife.

Sacredness is a deep traditional value of Native people

- Native people generally accept symbols of nature to be sacred i.e.
- Mountains, canyons, rivers, burial grounds, animals, etc.
- As well as some items and some traditional ceremonies

Character & Integrity

- Character—keeping your promises
 - Broken promises bring broken hearts, broken friendships and broken homes
- Integrity—being consistent, reliable, dependable, and even predictable

People love and have confidence in people who
have character and integrity

Order

Even the universe must have order to function properly.

- Rules bring order to our lives
- Rules must be:
 - Clear
 - Fair
 - Consistent

If rules are not clear, fair, and consistent, they are **basically useless**

Without Order, there is Chaos.

- Chaos: confusion & disorder
 - Loss of freedom
 - Can be individual, family or community
 - Willful rebellion & disobedience
 - Gossip, rumors & lies
 - Keeping secrets, isolation, resentment, fear
 - Blame and criticize others, may say “that’s life; that’s normal” **Not True, Not Normal!**

Life is a process of solving problems, when you stop solving problems you become the problem

Foundational Principals

- Rule or code of conduct to guide your life
 - Good and true principals
 - Never change
 - Apply to all our needs

“When a man values his privileges more than his principals, he soon loses both.”


