Funding Opportunities:

1. HHS, Administration for Children and Families Child Care Research Partnership Grants Grant to support research addressing issues related to Child Care and Development Fund

2. HHS, Office of Public Health and Science, Teenage Pregnancy Prevention: Research and Demonstration Programs grants to support research and demonstration programs for preventing teenage pregnancy. Funded projects are expected to generate lessons learned so others can benefit from these strategies and innovative approaches. Applicants can be considered for possible funding under two funding streams, Teenage Pregnancy Prevention (TPP) or personal Responsibility Education Program (PREP). Anticipated 45 awards \$400,000 - \$1,000,000. 3. IHS Injury Prevention Cooperative Agreement is accepting applications for two categories PART I includes two categories, (a) new applicants and (b) previously funded Part I applicants. All Part I applicants must meet the IHS minimum user population of 2,500. Part I (a) applicants are new to Tribal IPPs and have not received HIS Injury Prevention funding within the past two years.(b) Previously funded Part I (b) applicants are the 2005–2010 Tribal Injury Prevention Cooperative Agreement Program (TIPCAP) grantees. PART II is for applicants that will use effective strategies in 3-year projects with no population requirements. Approximately 40 awards will be issued under this program. Injury Prevention applicants may apply for more than one of the areas of funding (Part I (a) or (b) and/or Part II) but only one will be awarded. Part I (a) New: up to \$65,000. Part I (b) Previously funded: up to \$80,000. Part II Effective Strategy Projects: \$10,000. *Project Period:* This is a 5 year project for Part I and 3 years for Part II. *Programmatic Involvement:* The IPP staff will provide substantial oversight to monitor evidence based, effective and innovative strategies for high quality performance in sustaining capacity of the AI/AN IPP. 5. **Michael and Susan Dell Foundation - Helping Children in Urban Poverty Grants** funds projects that directly serve or impact children living in urban poverty, particularly in the areas of education, childhood health and family economic stability. Funding amount varies, generally not funding more than 25% of a project's budget or more than 10% of an organization's total annual operating expenses. Deadline: rolling. 7. **RWJF, Peaceful Pathways: Reducing Exposure to Violence** is a matching grants program. Applicants must be nominated by a diversity-focused funder that is principally concerned with the community to be served, and more information on diversity-focused funders may be found at www.givingforum.org. Projects must be new and work to reduce violence in the context of a specific community and use that community's strengths and assets to address threatening or violent behavior that results in emotional, psychological or physical harm. Funding Amount: Up to eight matching awards for \$50,000.00 to \$200,000.00 **Deadline: application accepted throughout 2010**, with submitted proposals reviewed May 5, Sept. 1, and January 5th.
