Dear Tribal Leader:

On July 26, 2012, I sent a letter requesting comments on the draft Policy on Conferring with Urban Indian Organizations (UIOs). As one additional opportunity to provide input, I am writing to invite you to attend the upcoming **Indian Health Service (IHS) Listening Session on the draft Policy on Conferring with Urban Indian Organizations** scheduled for Tuesday, January 22 from 1:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m. at the IHS Headquarters in Rockville, Maryland. This session will provide an opportunity for interested parties to provide oral comments on the draft Policy on Conferring with UIOs that was published in the *Federal Register* on July 26, 2012. As part of the Affordable Care Act, Congress reauthorized and amended the Indian Health Care Improvement Act (IHCIA). The IHCIA created a new requirement that the IHS "confer" with UIOs, to the maximum extent practicable, in carrying out the IHCIA. *See* 25 United States Code (U.S.C.) sections 1601(5), 1631(f), 1660d, and 1665k(a)(2)(A)(vii). The IHS will use this conferring policy to ensure that the health care needs of the urban Indian population are considered at the local, Area, and national levels, when implementing and carrying out the IHCIA.

Online registration for this event closes on Friday, January 18, at 12:00 p.m. After registration closes, all attendees must register on-site. Please arrive early to check in with Security.
