




## IHS Strategic Plan for 2018-2022

### L.N.F – What is it?

- Level of Need Funded (LNF) Methodology
- Calculates resource needs compared to cost of insuring the IHS user population with Federal employee health insurance
- Calculated for IHS as a whole, for IHS areas, and individually for each local level service delivery area
- 2 primary purposes:
  - A benchmark to help justify IHS budget requests
  - Allocate by formula certain earmarked funds to local level service delivery areas

## L.N.F – History

- Basis in law S1621 of Indian Health Care Improvement Act
- Funds Needed Funds Available = Funds Deficiency
  - Factors to calculate Need: Population, Costs, Health, Local
  - Factors for Funds Available: IHS, Federal, state, private
- 2000-2001Tribal/IHS workgroup developed technical details based on framework specified in law
- IHS adopted LNF methodology in 2001 after national Tribal consultation
- Methodology is unchanged, but a few data sources have evolved or improved.

### **Formula Allocations**

- A related part of the methodology is an allocation formula based on LNF scores (funding deficiency)
- Formula does not allocate base recurring IHS funding
- Formula applies only to funds that Congress earmarks for the IHCIF, e.g., none in recent years
- Formula concentrates funds to those local level service sites with the lowest LNF scores, e.g., those most resource deficient
- With agreement among Area Tribes, formula allocations within an Area may be adjusted for additional local circumstances, e.g., formula allocations elsewhere are unaffected

## 2017 Update

- IHS is in the process of updating LNF scores for nearly 300 local level service delivery areas
- Area offices are submitting detailed data
- Consistency checks and related forms of data verification is scheduled for December
- The calculation methodology itself is unchanged
- Preliminary results are expected in January 2018 in time for budget formulation and formula allocation (if any)
- A final report is expected in Spring 2018
