Logic Models are tools that link program inputs and activities to program products and outcomes. A well-constructed logic model will assist you in communicating the underlying theory (logic) that you have about why your activities are a good solution to the problem identified. The CDC's logic model guide provides guidance on constructing your logic model.

Epi Info for Data Management and Analysis

Epi Info is a free software package developed by the CDC to help researchers and practitioners in the global public health community manage their data. It provides easy questionnaire and database construction, data entry, and analysis with epidemiological statistics, graphs, and maps. National Digital Car Seat Check Form (NDCF)

The NDCF is a free resource offered for all certified child passenger safety technicians (CPSTs), instructors, CPS program managers, and the Indian Health Service (IHS) area injury prevention specialists. The NDCF is a great opportunity to streamline data and reduce reporting burdens for technicians. Each individual user has access to a personalized dashboard reflecting only their seat checks. CPSTs and program managers can use this data to:

- Compile data for grants, education, and reporting requirements
- Document time spent conducting CPS activities
- Identify trends and patterns of seat use and misuse
- Track seat check activity in real time

- **30-Second Chair Test**
- **4-Stage Balance Test**
- **Timed Up and Go (TUG) Test**
