- Work in IHS that may be paused during this lapse in appropriations period includes:
 - national policy development and issuance,
 - some oversight functions,
 - training,
 - and other work that does not have an immediate effect on the delivery of health care
- Impact on IHS Tribal Advisory Committee
 - Work will resume once an appropriation is approved

IHS Operations and Activities

• Excepted activities

 addresses emergency circumstances, such that the suspension of the function would imminently threaten the safety of human life or the protection of property (OMB).

Payments after Government Reopens

- Step 1: Congress must pass and the President must sign a full-year appropriation or a continuing resolution to fund the government.
- Step 2: The Office of Management and Budget provides an automatic apportionment of amounts appropriated under the CR percentage of the previous fiscal year level for the period of the CR.
- Step 3: The IHS Office of Finance and Accounting allots the funding to IHS Areas.
 - By allot, we mean the transfer of obligational authority.
- Step 4: The Area Offices work with the appropriate offices to confirm amounts to paid with the terms of funding agreement.
- Step 5: Payment documents are processed for clearance and signature to award.
- Step 6: Once approved, funds are obligated and payment is transmitted electronically to the Tribe or Urban Indian Organization.
