

“Prevention of Birth Defects, Health Promotion, and Disease Prevention”

The Conference on AI/AN Maternal/Child Health: Prevention of Birth Defects, Health Promotion, and Disease Prevention is a four-day multidisciplinary course that focuses on practical approaches to the recognition, management, consultation and referral of health problems of American Indian & Alaska Native Women and their children. The course is designed for IHS, Tribal and Urban primary care providers and nurses. Physicians, clinical nurses, nurse practitioners, nurse-midwives, and physician assistants attend a variety of lectures and interactive workshops. Courses are taught by a faculty that has expertise in providing health care to women and children in I/T/U health care facilities.

Those of you who have attended the ACOG/IHS Denver Course will recognize this conference. While it maintains many of the features that keep participants interested year after year; you will also discover some new additions that will be beneficial to your practice.

One of those features is a pre-conference Neonatal Resuscitation Provider certification session on Sunday morning. The Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO) certification will be available again this year. ALSO lectures and workshops will be integrated throughout the course schedule for the benefit of all attendees. The ALSO lectures and workshops are open to everyone but only those who wish to pay the additional fee of \$150 and take the written and oral hands-on exam will be certified. The benefit of having more hands-on workshops to choose from is a great addition to the program.

Objectives

As a result of attending the course, attendees will:

- Develop an enhanced understanding of the principles of women's and neonatal health care optimally practiced in rural and sometimes remote settings such as those served by Indian Health Service, Tribal, and Urban health programs.
- Promote prevention of birth defects, enhance disease prevention/health maintenance, and encourage early diagnosis and culturally sensitive clinical and systems intervention strategies in the assessment and treatment of women and neonates in Level I hospitals, low risk maternity units, or ambulatory health centers.
- Identify high risk women and neonates who would best be managed in larger secondary or tertiary care centers as part of a formalized regional perinatal and gynecologic consultation, referral, and clinical care program.
- Develop an increased awareness of how to utilize IHS, tribal and state systems for improved delivery of clinical women's and child health care.
