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Jennifer Wolff is Associate Professor of Health Policy and Management at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and Division of Geriatric Medicine and Gerontology at the Johns Hopkins

University School of Medicine. Dr. Wolff's research primarily focuses on late-life family caregiving and innovative models of care for older adults with complex health needs.

Her research has been continuously funded by federal agencies and private foundations. Dr. Wolff currently leads two NIH-funded studies that seek to develop practical tools to more effectively identify and support family caregivers in care delivery. Dr. Wolff is a member of AcademyHealth and the Gerontological Society of America and serves on the Institute of Medicine Committee on Family Caregiving for Older Adults.
