- Goals
 - Screening defined at-risk population
 - Assess all with positive screen
 - Initiate and complete treatment with medication at a reasonable price
 - Key Resources
 - Defined protocols for screening and assessment
 - Consultation for developing and establishing key aspects of the program
 - Specialty consultation available from UCSF
 - Data management support
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CURRENT INVOLVEMENT

- 21 clinics in CAO are participating
 - 5 urban and 16 tribal
 - We welcome new participants
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EMPHASIS IN OTHER AREAS

- Key Public Health activities
 - *HIV Screening*
 - *Influenza vaccination*
 - *STI monitoring*
 - Miscellaneous
 - *Diabetes (particularly if special funding awarded)*
 - *Another area of choice associated with GPRA measurements*
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INFLUENZA VACCINATION

- What do we want to see?
 - Minimum goal – 70% of eligible population will have seasonal coverage
 - Key question – how many eligible will refuse?
 - Some reports indicate this could be a sizeable proportion in our communities
 - What can we do to account for this known circumstance and still meet the 70% goal?
 - One thought – establish a goal that 100% of the eligible and willing patients will be vaccinated
 - Precisely honed education programs delivered by trusted community leaders to change at least a few perspectives
