Desert Sage Intake Process

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American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) Levels of Care

- Level I Outpatient
- Level II Intensive Outpatient
- Level II Partial Hospitalization
- Level III Residential Treatment Desert Sage

ASAM Placement Criteria for Residential Care

Poor ability to tolerate and cope with withdrawal symptoms

Poor ability to tolerate and cope with physical problems. Stable conditions that are being neglected in outpatient care

Recovery efforts are negatively affected by emotional, behavioral, or cognitive conditions in significant and distracting ways

ASAM Placement Criteria (cont.)

- Significant functional impairment in areas of family, social, work, or school that can not be managed at less intensive level of care
- Interventions at current level of care have not achieved stabilization or remission of symptoms
- Exhibits inconsistent follow through with minimal awareness of SUD and need for treatment

ASAM Placement Criteria (cont.)

Unaware of need or unwilling to change/follow through with treatment recommendations

Inability to overcome environmental triggers/cravings. High chronicity/poor treatment response

Home environment is dangerous to recovery

Desert Sage Intake Criteria

- Meets ASAM criteria for residential care
- Age 12-17 (within 6 months of 18th birthday)
- Current diagnosis of substance use disorder (moderate severe)
- Voluntary
- Can have co-occurring mental health diagnoses

Exclusion Criteria

- Actively suicidal/homicidal
- Significant history of violence
- Psychosis
- Uncontrolled or high risk medical conditions
- Extreme flight risk

Referral Process

- Call to obtain admission packet and provide summary information (951)708-4019
- Submit completed admission packet to include:
 - Educational records
 - Physical exam (within 30 days)
 - Applicable laboratory and immunization reports
 - ► IHS eligibility documentation
 - Available treatment records and documentation of diagnosis (MH, SUD)
 - Criminal/legal documents

Treatment Team Determination

Treatment team will review information for appropriateness of admission to Desert Sage

Intake/Aftercare Coordinators will work with referral source to identify appropriate facility if deemed inappropriate for Desert Sage

Unsuitable Referrals

Desert Sage Intake/Aftercare Coordinators will work with referring clinic to identify appropriate placement

Appropriate residential care for substance use disorder will be reimbursed through CAO funds if available

▶ 30 day reviews identifying continued need for treatment, discharge plan, and any barriers to on time discharge are required for CAO funded placements

Summary

ASAM criteria are essential when determining need for residential treatment

Desert Sage has first right of refusal for residential SUD treatment

Outside referrals will be made if Desert Sage is unable to accommodate
