- Meeting in Washington D.C February 16-17 2017
- Theme "Fulfilling the Trust Responsibility: A New Partnership to Provide Quality Healthcare to America's First Citizens"
- All California Area health priorities voted on by Tribal leaders fell within the top 6 priorities nationally
- Supplemental language for additional funding added to the national budget narrative for health priorities

Health Priority Narratives for Additional Funding Fiscal Year 2019

- 1. Advanced appropriations with Direct Service and HQ to have the same flexibility as self-governance
 - Funding would become available one year or more after the year of the appropriations act in which it is contained
 - Ability to reallocate or redirect funding without IHS approval
- 2. Maximize Revitalization Act.
 - Funding applicable to infrastructure for those Areas that are underserved and lacking resources
 - Requested funds would be in addition to existing funds to support all phases of the infrastructure (construction)

Health Priority Narratives continued...

- 3. IHS to reset CHEF threshold to \$19,000 (from \$25,000) and eliminate inflationary increases
- 4. Preservation of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act. Maintain & expand Medicaid. Fully fund long term healthcare
 - Section 2901 Health programs operated by IHS I/T/U shall be Payer of Last Resort for services
 - Section 2902 Elimination of Sunset for reimbursement for Medicare Part B services
 - Section 9021 Health benefits to tribal members not included as taxable income
