


Case Study



HOW COMMON ARE ACES?


% of study respondents reporting # of ACEs



Based on the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System



Types of ACEs reported






ADDRESSING ACES IN CHILDHOOD CAN POTENTIALLY DECREASE:





AIANs fare worse than Whites across many health measures.








AlANs live across the United States, but 60% reside in 11 states. The majority of AlANs live outside of tribal areas.





ACES BY TYPE CALIFORNIA 2020-2021







PERCENTAGE OF ADULT POPULATION



1.46 increased risk for preterm delivery


1.9 increased risk for low birth-weight baby


Pregnant Black people with depression:











THE IMPACT OF UNINTENDED PREGNANCIES: INFANT & MATERNAL



- Late prenatal care
- Smoking/drinking/substance use during pregnancy
- Prematurity/Low birth weight
- Reduced breastfeeding
- Low relationship quality
- Increased risk of physical violence during pregnancy




Number of Adverse Childhood Experiences






MATERNAL DEATHS, 2018 - 2021


Indigenous Doula Training in April

On April 4-8, 2023, UIHS, in partnership with FIRST FIVE, will host an Indigenous Doula Training conducted by the Alaska Native Birthworkers. More information to be posted on Facebook in January. Training will be free and will prepare participants to work as Indigenous Doulas.

A doula is a professional labor assistant who provides physical and emotional support to Birthing People and their families during pregnancy, childbirth and the postpartum period.

Effective January 1, 2023, the California Department of Health Services will reimburse for doula services to birthing people.


