Learn the nuances of SBIRT, a proven tool that encourages follow-thru with patients using alcohol and other substances. Providers will learn about the SBIRT Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA) measure, screening tools for screening for alcohol and substance use, tips for motivational interview, and methods for referral to treatment.

Outcomes/Objectives:

- 1. Examine the rationale for universal screening and information on SBIRT screening tools, procedures, and motivational interviewing.
- 2. Identify how SBIRT is conducted in primary care.
- 3. Apply screening tools for substance use and appropriate referral for patients to treatment.
- 4. Implement strategies and to sustain SBIRT at your site.
