Dr. Davis has assisted Tribes and States in several capacities, including the Oregon Senate Committee On Health Care's Dental Therapy Workgroup (2020), the Washington State Task Force on Dental Therapy (2021), Skagit Valley College dəxʷxayəbus Dental Therapy Education Program Advisory Committee (2019-2022), Oregon Board of Dentistry's Dental Therapy Rules Oversight Committee (2021-present), Native Oral Health Network - Steering Committee (2021-present), Oregon HPV Dental Task Force (2020-2022), and others. She also serves as faculty for Indian Country Oral Health ECHO, and provides clinical care and supervision for dental therapists in Tribal clinics. Dr. Davis has worked in Tribal clinics in Washington and Oregon for over fifteen years, in private practice for five years, and she has worked as a volunteer in several countries. She earned a DDS from the University of the Pacific School of Dentistry in San Francisco and a MPH from the University of Washington School of Public Health, and she continues to learn from every clinic, patient, and provider with whom she works.
