# YRTC Outreach Efforts:

- 5 minute YRTC video.
- Site tours of the facility.
- Presentations to Tribal leaders, healthcare programs, and the community.

# **Opening Activity:**

- Intake/Aftercare team began accepting admission applications April 2017.
- All staff must undergo extensive training.
- July 24, 2017 Accepted our first resident into the Desert Sage Youth Wellness Center.

#### Clinical/Treatment Program:

- 3 Licensed Clinical Social Workers.
- 3 Substance Use Disorder Counselors.
- 3 Psychiatric Technicians.
- Tele-psychiatric evaluations are conducted within 72 hours by the contracted IHS psychiatrist.
- Implementing AA Meetings and NA meetings as part of treatment program.







### **Nursing Program**:

- Hired Director of Nursing / Nurse Practitioner.
- Currently 1 Nurse Practitioner; 3 Registered Nurses; and 2 Licensed Vocational Nurses.
- Provide medication management and health education.



### **Educational Services Program:**

- Hired 1 credentialed full-time teacher who provides core content courses in math, science, social studies, and English.
- Continued discussions with Bureau of Indian Education, Sherman Indian School, regarding collaborative efforts on providing a credentialed education program.
- Upon request, and after discharge, the Desert Sage Youth Wellness Center will provide a detailed transcript of all courses completed.








#### Residential Services Program:

- Desert Sage currently employs 22
   Resident Assistants (and 2 supervisors).
- Two pods currently in operation One Female Pod and One Male Pod (each Pod accommodates 8 Residents).
- Resident Assistants are stewards to our Residents and provide life skill directions in the areas of cleaning, grooming, hygiene, laundering, and everyday life rules and behavior, etc.











#### Resident Activities

- <u>Activities</u>:
  - Educational Field Trips
  - Cultural Events
  - Outdoor Recreation






BARONA Cultural Center & Museum











- Will work with Native American resources to bring culturally-acceptable activities to the youth (Elder Speakers, Community Speakers, Artists, Crafts, etc.).
- Will assure recreational/physical activities are suitable and meet the needs of the residents.











### **Update on Food Service Program:**

- Desert Sage currently 3 cooks (eventually will have 4).
- Food Service Program prepares three hot meals a day, as well as access to a salad bar and snacks at night.
- Supervisor works with CAO Dietician/Nutritionist to assure that nutritional and dietary needs are met (portion control, sodium content, calorie count, etc.).
- Supervisor works with Nursing Department to assure dietary needs (allergies, sodium intake, gluten/dairy restrictions, etc.) are addressed.

# Challenges:

- Recruitment and Retention Efforts.
- Background Investigation Backlog.
- Census/Referrals (getting information out to community members).

# YRTC Aftercare Pilot Project

- \$810 k for 3 years
- Establish a statewide workgroup with 8 pilot sites
- Develop and pilot an aftercare plan that is:
  - Structured
  - Evidence-based
  - Culturally-based
  - Engages youth and families before, during, & after treatment
  - Incorporates social media & peer support
- Evaluate outcomes disseminates results nationwide

### Travel Reimbursement

- Travel to and from the YRTC will be reimbursed at \$500 per trip. This includes travel to bring the youth to the YRTC (admission), family therapy visit, or discharge of the youth.
- All travel must be pre-approved and follow Federal Travel Regulations.
- Travel will be reimbursed to the Program, not the individual family members.
- Travel reimbursement amounts will change next year.
