COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING STUDENTS

Variety of nursing training programs to become RN:

- Associate's degree in nursing (ADN) typically community colleges (no community health nursing course/clinical requirement)
- Bachelor's degree in nursing (BSN) typically CSUs
- RN-BSN typically CSUs, also online
- Master's entry program in nursing (MEPN) UCSF School of Nursing, UC Davis Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing, Samuel Merritt

WHY PARTNER WITH SCHOOLS OF NURSING?

- Improve nursing recruitment by engaging nursing students, increasing their interest in your programs
- Inspire future nurses who will serve in and represent your community
- Expand your programmatic assessments, planning processes, interventions
- Enhance client health with more individualized care, wellness promotion, acute/chronic condition management



WHAT CAN COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING STUDENTS DO?

Individual nursing assessments and care delivery in community settings, supporting:

- Home visiting e.g., mother-child dyads, seniors
- School health/nursing school-aged children and families, staff wellness
- Public health settings e.g., CPS, communicable diseases, ambulatory care



WHAT CAN COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING STUDENTS DO?

Population health activities:

- Community health assessments
- Program planning or coordination
- Health education with groups, families
- Mass screenings, immunization clinics, health fairs



COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING CLINICAL PARTNERSHIP

- Community Health Nursing for Professional Nurses and Leadership in the Community
- Lecture & clinical
- Learning concepts of community health
- Clinical is an elective
- Complete 90 hours clinical



• Typically one full day over the 12 weeks of the semester

COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINICAL PARTNERSHIP

- Who are the students?
 - Students in our RN to BSN program
 - Have their RN license and have returned to school to get their BSN
 - Most have experience in nursing
 - Some are new grads



COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINICAL PARTNERSHIPS



COMMUNITY HEALTH CLINICAL PARTNERSHIP

Home visitation

- Students are assigned to Birth & Beyond sites
- Each clinical day students are paired with home visitors
- Home visits are attended jointly
 - Health education
 - Questions from the family
 - General assessment
