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

# Introduction to Injury Prevention

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## Course Description

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This 3 day course introduces participants to injuries as a public health problem. It addresses the principles of effective injury prevention through a combination of presentations, case histories, and group exercises.

Emphasis is placed on the following core injury prevention program topics:

- The Public Health Approach
- Injury Data
- Program Design & Implementation
- Program Evaluation
- Coalitions & Collaborations
- Program Management
- Marketing & Advocacy

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## Course Objectives

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Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Understand the public health impact of injuries in Tribal communities.
- Use data to identify injury patterns and contributing factors in order to target comprehensive intervention strategies.
- Plan injury prevention interventions based on effective, public health strategies.

- Describe the benefits of community-based injury prevention coalitions and collaborations.
- Describe the stages of evaluation.
- Present injury prevention proposals to a community audience.

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
## Date & Location
