ENS Kenney served as a summer COSTEP for the Billings Area IHS-OEHE Program. Anne assisted with the Injury Prevention Program and conducted the following assignments:

“Intentional and Un-intentional Injury among American Indians in Montana and Wyoming”

ENS Kenney assisted the IHS and the Montana Wyoming Tribal Leaders Council’s Rocky Mountain Tribal Epidemiology (MTWYTLC/RMTEC) Project in implementation of its Intentional and Un-intentional Injury project. Anne worked closely with the IHS Assistant Area Injury Prevention Specialist; the MTWYTLC/RMTEC Statistician and the MTWYTLC/RMTEC Director to collect, clean analyze and report on intentional and Un-intentional Injuries among American Indians in Montana and Wyoming (IHS Service Population). An Injury Community Health Profile and a poster abstract will be the outcome of this project.

Service Unit Site Visits

ENS Kenney assisted with site visits to the IHS Service Units and Tribal Programs. The purpose of the site visits is to get an orientation of the IHS Service Unit/Tribal Environmental Health Programs and Injury Prevention Programs. ENS Kenney also assisted with the Crow Native Days Youth Events and provided assistance with the bicycle rodeo, safety presentations and the child safety seat clinics.

Collect Motor Vehicle Police Reports

ENS Kenney collected the motor vehicle crash list from the Wyoming Department of Transportation and conducted the GPS plotting of the crash sites at the Wind River Service Unit in Wyoming. She also conducted prep work for other motor vehicle crash projects by GPS plotting mile markers at the Fort Peck, Fort Belknap, and Wind River Service Units. The information will be utilized for the GPS mapping of all motor vehicle crash sites and recommendations for the Tribes.

Montana/Wyoming Native Youth Academy

ENS Kenney attended the Native Youth academy and also served as clan leader for the youths. As a clan leader, she was in charge of a group of youth and participated in all activities throughout the week that included wellness, diabetes, and injury prevention. The event was sponsored by the Billings Area IHS Health Promotion Program and the Montana/Wyoming Tribal Leaders Council.
