The dental program has since grown from one to three clinics with 16 operatories and 22 full time staff members. Dr. Anderson designed the dental clinics, selected all the equipment and obtained funding for an Electronic Dental Record that interfaces with RPMS and connects all 3 sites.

During his time serving the Oneida Nation Dr. Ottesen has developed, introduced and organized numerous programs to benefit patients, the community, and staff.

Some of Dr. Ottesen's accomplishments include:

- Manager to establish fluoride varnish program
- Instituted Denture Days to encourage denture patients to visit the dental clinic
- Developed Sonicare toothbrush incentive program for diabetic patients
- Introduced bell-scope technology to improve cancer screening
- Organized a retreat and staff development day
- Worked with hygienist and nurse manager to train LPNs in fluoride varnish application
- Has applied to State University of New York at Buffalo as an Associate Professor

Lt. Danielle Barstad, DDS

Dr. Barstad joined the dental program at the Hopi Health Care Center (HHCC), as a staff dental officer, in August 2004. Dr. Barstad served for two years as an Assistant Dental Recruiter for the Phoenix area, an IHS externship preceptor, a GPRA coordinator and a xylitol gum prevention program coordinator. Dr. Barstad is also a faculty member of the Arizona School of Dentistry and Oral Health and Northern Arizona University School of Hygiene.

Dr. Barstad's achievements include:

Researched and provided data to National Health Service Corps increasing the Health Professional Shortage Area score from 11 to 19 making the HHCC eligible to receive two scholars. Then wrote a guide for the ADO to distribute to dental Chiefs

Wrote and was awarded a \$50,000 Perio/Diabetes Program Grant, used funds to recruit a hygienist for five months

Created and coordinated Xylitol Gum Prevention Program. Obtained 100% permission for daily gum chewing by 52 students for two years under teacher supervision

Monitors, instructs and evaluates student externs increasing clinic production by 360 patients in 60 days

Recruited ten students and four faculty members for an externship at HHCC

Co-supervisor at HHCC for two "Native Student Workers" program in the Workforce Investment Act Program of the Hopi Tribe

Participant in the "Indigenous Pride Program" to recruit Native American youth into health services

She provides one on one nutrition, smoking cessation and oral health education to prenatal and postpartum women. Lcdr Black is an Adjunct Professor with The University of Oklahoma Health and Science Center, supervising hygiene students during extramural rotations at CIH. In 2000, Lcdr Black was part of a grant writing team that received HP/DP grants for \$30,000 and \$13,600 used to increase community awareness through activities, caries risk testing on prenatal mothers and presentations to Head Start programs throughout Oklahoma.
