TARGET AUDIENCE:

Physicians, Nurses, Registered Dietitians, Health Promoters, Fitness Specialist, Environmental Health Professionals other members of the care team and other interested parties.

DESCRIPTION:

Although people with behavioral health conditions represent about 25 percent of the U.S. adult population, they account for nearly 40 percent of all cigarettes smoked and can experience serious health consequences. Smoking cessation services are not routinely provided in mental health or addiction treatment settings. A growing body of research shows that quitting smoking can improve mental health and addiction recovery outcomes. Research shows that many smokers with behavioral health conditions want to quit, can quit, and benefit from proven smoking cessation treatments. However, many myths and treatment “culture” norms have hindered addressing nicotine addiction in this population.

OBJECTIVES:

1. Conceptualize the magnitude of tobacco use by persons with mental and/or substance use disorders.
2. Breakdown the myths and barriers that have hindered reducing tobacco use in this population.
3. Implement evidence-based best practices for reducing tobacco use in this population.
