CDR Angela Fallon, an enrolled member of the Tohono O’odham Nation and a descendant of the Assiniboine and Sioux Tribes of Fort Peck, Montana, serves as the Deputy Director of the Office of Clinical and Preventative Services (OCPS) for the Indian Health Service (IHS). In this position, CDR Fallon provides leadership in voicing the clinical, preventive, and public health needs of AI/AN, including consultation and technical support to clinical and public health program functions.

CDR Fallon most recently served as the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) for Tohono O’odham Nation Health Care (TONHC), responsible for administering a comprehensive health care delivery system. During her time as CEO, she was instrumental in the transition from Sells Service Unit to Tohono O’odham Nation Health Care.

Prior to her work as TONHC CEO, CDR Fallon held various roles with the Tucson Area Sells Service Unit. She served as Facility Director for Santa Rosa Health Center, Director of Public Health Nursing, and was appointed as the Nurse Consultant for Tucson Area Office. Her previous assignments include Improvement Advisor, Public Health Nurse Consultant, and Community Health Representative Coordinator for Phoenix Area Office.

Earlier in her career, CDR Fallon acted as Special Diabetes Program for Indians (SDPI) Program Administrator for the Tohono O’odham Nation Department of Health and Human Services. She also worked as a Clinical Nurse at Phoenix Indian Medical Center (PIMC).

CDR Fallon is a veteran of the U.S. Army with more than 15 years of healthcare leadership experience and is currently a nurse officer in the Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service. CDR Fallon holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing from Arizona State University and a Master’s in Business Administration.
