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Preface

The purpose of this addendum is to provide technical information specific to the Patient Care Component (PCC) Suite (BJPC) v2.0 p32. This Data Entry Mnemonics addendum provides information regarding the additions and changes to mnemonics within the Resource and Patient Management System PCC.

1.0 Introduction

The changes detailed in this document are provided within Indian Health Service (IHS) Patient Care Component (PCC) Suite (BJPC) v2.0 p32. They will be integrated into future versions of the software and user manuals. These changes will no longer be considered an addendum at the time of the next version release.

This addendum provides written guidance only on changes made in the current patch that are relevant to the data entry mnemonics. To see a list of all changes, please refer to the patch notes for each of the respective patches.

1.1 Summary of Changes

This patch contains enhancements to the PCC Data Entry Mnemonics:

- Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) mnemonic has been added to capture Continuous Glucose Monitoring data.
- Normal/Negative has been added as an allowable value for Exam (51) Pressure Injury Skin Exam, within the Examinations mnemonic.

2.0 Patch 32 Changes

2.1 Mnemonics

2.1.1 Continuous Glucose Monitoring (CGM) Mnemonic

Use mnemonic CGM to capture Continuous Glucose Monitoring data. The user is prompted to enter data in the following fields:

The user is prompted to enter data in the following fields:

REPORT DATE:
REPORT PERIOD START DATE:
REPORT PERIOD END DATE:
DURATION (DAYS):
GMI - GLUCOSE MGMT INDICATOR %:
    Type a number between 2 and 20, 2 decimal digits.
TIME IN TARGET RANGE (TIR) %:
    Type a number between 0 and 100, 2 decimal digits.
TARGET RANGE LOW VALUE(mg/dL):
    Type a number between 60 and 150, 0 decimal digits.
TARGET RANGE HIGH VALUE(mg/dL):
    Type a number between 90 and 250, 0 decimal digits.
```

2.1.2 Examinations (EX)

Use the Examinations (EX) mnemonic to record the type of exam performed during a patient visit (for visit-related-only encounters). Some of the exam types are reported in the Health Summary in the Health Maintenance Reminders component, along with the date on which the exam was performed and a due date for the next exam. The following list shows available exam types.
