Preface

The purpose of this manual is to provide installation information for the Personal Health Record (BPHR) package. The BPHR package is designed to enable verified patients to request and view their Resource and Patient Management System (RPMS) data online.

1.0 Release Notes

This is the first release of the Personal Health Record (PHR) application. The PHR is an on-line health record, accessible to patients, containing their medical history. Examples of items contained in a PHR are: clinical and hospital visits, laboratory results, medication history, chronic diseases, etc. BPHR enables patients to access their medical history to manage their health care. As a Meaningful Use (MU) stage two certification requirement, a Performance measure needs to know if a patient logged onto the PHR and if a patient used secure messaging.

2.0 Installation Notes

Prefix: BPHR

Current Version: 2.1

Note: Read entire notes file prior to attempting any installation.

- All patches to Version 2.1 will be cumulative
- Make a copy of this distribution for offline storage.
- Print all notes and readme files.
- It is recommended that terminal output during the Kernel Installation and Distribution System (KIDS) installation be captured using an auxport printer attached to the terminal at which the user is performing the software installation or using a screen capture. This capture combined with the KIDS entry in the INSTALL file will ensure a printed audit trail should any problems arise.

2.3 Before You Begin: Installation Issues

2.3.1 BPHR Web Service

During the installation process, the connection information to the Personal Health Record server will be automatically included. A menu option has been provided to change this information if it becomes necessary in the future.

2.3.2 BPHR Package – Central Processing Unit (CPU) Capacity

The BPHR Application Programming Interface (API) calls should not have a noticeable impact on the CPU capacity.

3.0 Installation Instructions

3.1 Pre-KIDS Installation Setup Configuration

There are no special RPMS pre-KIDS installation setup configuration needed.

3.2 KIDS Installation Instructions

This section details the steps required to install the BPHR KIDS package. This is a new package with new routines, so there should not be anything on the system to back up or compare.

Also, no options need to be taken out of service because the components to be added will not be directly added to any existing options.

3.2.1 Pre-Installation

If possible, initially load the software into a test account, then into the production account. There are no routines or globals to remove after the installation is complete.

3.2.2 BPHR Installation

- 1. From the **KIDS** menu, select the **Installation** menu.
- 2. From the **XPD Main > Installation** menu, select **Option 1: Load a Distribution**.
- 3. Type **bphr0210.k** at the "Enter a Host File" prompt. Please note the file path might need to precede the file name with the appropriate host path. This is the file to retrieve from the appropriate software directory.
- 4. Type **Yes** (or press ENTER to accept the default) at the "Want to Continue with Load? YES//" prompt.
- 5. KIDS file bphr0210.k contains the following installation file:

- 6. From the **Installation** menu, select **Option 2: Verify Checksums in Transport Global**. This option provides a mechanism for ensuring the integrity of your routines. This step verifies checksums for the components of the Transport global, and reports any errors uncovered.
- 7. Type **IHS PERSONAL HEALTH RECORD 2.1** as the install name.

Optional: At this time, you can elect to exercise one of the following installation options. If you elect to use one of these, use **IHS PERSONAL HEALTH RECORD 2.1** as the install name.

- a. Back Up a Transport Global this option creates a MailMan message that will back up all current routines on the system that would be replaced by this release. (Because this is a new release no files will be replaced.).
- b. Compare Transport Global this option allows you to view all changes that will result from the installation of this patch and compares them with the values currently loaded on the system (routines, data dictionaries, templates, etc.).
- 8. From the **Installation** menu, select the **Install Packages(s)** option.
- 9. At the **Select Install Name** prompt, type **IHS PERSONAL HEALTH RECORD 2.1.**
- 10. Respond to the following prompts as indicated:
 - a. At the "Want KIDS to Rebuild Menu Trees Upon Completion of Install? YES//" prompt, type **NO**.
 - b. At the "Want KIDS to INHIBIT LOGONs during the install?//YES" prompt, type **NO**.
 - c. At the "Want to DISABLE Scheduled Options, Menu Options and Protocols?// YES" prompt, type **NO**.
- 11. Type the device that will print the install messages.
- 12. Exit the **Installation** menu.

3.2.3 PHR Web Service

The installation includes the PHR web service information. As part of the install, a menu option has been imported if it ever becomes necessary to change any information on how to connect to the PHR server. Instructions will be given on how to use this option.

5.0 Installation Configuration

There are two globals associated with the package in RPMS; BPHRCLS and BPHR. Neither global needs to be journaled and neither global will increase in size.

Glossary

Personal Health Record

An on-line health record, accessible to patients, containing their medical history. Examples of items contained in a PHR are: clinical and hospital visits, laboratory results, medication history, chronic diseases, etc.

Resource and Patient Management System (RPMS)

A series of integrated software components that includes clinical, administrative, and financial functions.
