

OUIHP Background

- The Indian Health Care Improvement Act (IHCIA) directed the establishment of the OUIHP to provide central oversight of Urban Indian health programs and services.
- There are currently 41 non-profit UIOs nationwide funded through grants and contracts from the IHS.
- The programmatic decision-making is guided and organized through the development of a strategic plan that aims to support the overall IHS mission and OUIHP goals and objectives to support UIOs.
- This presentation summarizes the planning activities and support needed, providing a framework for achieving the IHS's Urban Indian health priorities over the next five years.



Implementation - Work Plan

The 2023 Work Plan is a living document that outlines actions to address priorities. It will include public-facing communications quarterly on progress and accomplishments.

Monitoring – OUIHP will track progress for each activity and look for sustained progress over time.

Reporting – Updates on the work will be shared with UIOs, partners, and stakeholders and posted to the IHS website.

Action Steps:

 Support grantees with technical assistance, training, and feedback.

Support internal process improvement and team development.

Action Steps:

Share HRSA communications and updates with UIOs.

Action Steps:

Support UIOs' efforts to recruit and retain staff.

Action Steps:

 Support inclusion of UIOs in the national Community Health Aide/Practitioner, Behavioral Health Aide, and Dental Health Aide/Therapists programs.

Action Steps:

 Engage UIOs in communications and efforts in data management and inclusion in Health Information Technology (HIT) initiatives.

Support development of auto-generated reports for UIOs with no D1 account.

Objective 4: To improve data that supports urban reference data.

Action Steps:

 Support efforts to define 'service area', validate data in Standard Code Book, and resolve discrepancies.



Goal 2: Partner with UIOs and other Urban stakeholders to improve data accuracy and quality

Objective 1: Partner with NCUIH data workgroup to improve UIO data accuracy and quality.

Action Steps:

 Engage in collaborative efforts with NCUIH on issues and strategic priorities.

Goal 2: Partner with UIOs and other urban stakeholders to improve data accuracy and quality

Objective 2: Work with UIOs to achieve 100% data mapping to the National Data Warehouse.

Action Steps:

 Support updates to Urban Site Mapping Data request and develop resources/guidance/training on the mapping process.

Goal 3: Train UIOs on data collection

Objective 1: Provide technical assistance and training webinars on a broad range of data collection-related topics.

Action Steps:

 Support UIOs through webinars/training materials and data quality reports.



Goal 3: Train UIOs on data collection

Objective 2: Develop resource repository (trainings, templates, etc.) to support accessibility of archived data education materials.

Action Steps:

 Create and maintain a resource repository on the IHS OUIHP website.

Goal 1: Ensure individual UIOs' infrastructure needs are identified and addressed

Objective 1: Complete a UIO infrastructure study (priorities and unmet needs) that provides individual UIO infrastructure assessment reports, with strategies to support future UIO infrastructure development.

Action Steps:

Engage UIOs in the development of an Infrastructure Study.

Goal 1: Ensure individual UIOs' infrastructure needs are identified and addressed

Objective 2: Provide support to UIOs on the amended IHCIA provision authorizing IHS to make funds available for renovations, construction, and/or expansion of UIO facilities.

Action Steps:

 Engage in partnerships with Headquarters and Area Offices to assist UIOs with constructionrelated activities.

Objective 1: Continued Urban Confer with UIOs in the development and implementation of HIT modernization.

Action Steps:

Support UIOs in HIT modernization development.

Action Steps:

Identify unserved urban centers.
