



Lisa Gyorda Acting Director Office of Human Resources Indian Health Service

Lisa Gyorda, an enrolled member of the Oglala Sioux Tribe, is the acting director of the Office of Human Resources and acting chief human capital officer for the Indian Health Service. The IHS, an agency within the Department of Health and Human Services, is the principal federal health care advocate and provider for American Indians and Alaska Natives.

As Acting Director, Gyorda is responsible for providing strategic guidance and leadership for all aspects of the human resources function and establishing a vision and direction for the full complement of core human capital programs. This includes providing leadership and direction in the development of HR policies that promote maximum effectiveness in the IHS workforce while supporting the IHS mission. She continues the OneHR initiative and advises senior agency officials on the implementation and execution of key HR programs. She has extensive experience in federal human resources, executive leadership, strategic human capital management, workforce planning, and organizational development.

Gyorda most recently served as the director of Human Resources Operations at the Internal Revenue Service where she oversaw all operations activities including talent acquisition, employee and labor relations, and employee shared services. Prior to this role, she served as the IHS Human Resources director where she was instrumental in creating and launching the newly established Headquarters HR organization in 2014. She also worked for the National Institutes of Health where she gained valuable knowledge of federal HR, including staffing and recruitment, classification and position management, employee relations, and compensation policy.

She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in business and management from the University of Maryland.
