## **Minnesota State Tribal Relations**

- Federally-Recognized Tribes: Eleven
- State Tribal Consultation Policy: Minnesota's state-wide consultation policy was originally approved in October 2002 in an Executive Order signed by then-Governor Jesse Ventura (<a href="http://www.perm.org/articles/a173.html">http://www.perm.org/articles/a173.html</a>). Each successive governor, Governor Tim Pawlenty and current Governor Mark Dayton, have issued an Executive Order requiring Government to Government consultation.

- **State Agency Tribal Liaisons**: A number of state agencies have individuals assigned as tribal liaisons. A list is attached.
- State Advisory Committee on Tribal Issues: The State Advisory Committee, the
  Minnesota Indian Affairs Council (MIAC), is composed of the chairs of the 11 Minnesota

   In addition to the MIAC, Minnesota has several topic-specific advisory councils. Those

  - o Indian Child Welfare Advisory Council (Comprising tribal appointees -- predominantly Child Welfare directors -- and urban Indian representatives)
  - American Indian Chemical Health Advisory Council (Comprising tribal appointees -predominantly chemical dependency treatment directors -- and urban Indian representatives)
  - American Indian Mental Health Advisory Committee (Comprising tribal appointees -- predominantly mental health directors -- and urban Indian representatives)
