 - DEHS staff meeting in October focused on completing strategic plan
 - o Developed last goal and vision statement
 - Plan finalized, distributed and initiated
 - FDA standardization: Alyssa Bernido at Phoenix Area, Eastern Arizona District Office working with CDR Snyder on FDA standardization; this is the first step toward one of our strategic plan objectives
 - Area staff partnering with OPH on program reviews of several tribal health programs



- ii. Emergency Preparedness
 - Highland Fire blew escalated a few days ago in Riverside County
 - Grew from 10 acres to 1400+ acres in 5 hours
 - Precautionary evacuation of the Desert Sage Healing Center
 - Center reoccupied the following day as firefighters contained fire
 - Fire currently at 2487 acres and 25% contained with mandatory evacuation orders being downgraded
 - The Area held an ICS tabletop in July and has scheduled a COOP tabletop for August with an IT focused scenario to satisfy a mandate from HQ.

 - Area staff partnering with HFE on providing technical assistance to Sacred Oaks Healing Center who is in the process of seeking accreditation by TJC

 - ii. Gen EH
 - Continuing support for expansion of services to new tribes in Virginia
 - Two new health centers under construction
 - Initiated a discussion with Office of Tribal Affairs
 - regarding service population for IP shares
 - iii. Emergency management
 - Area Director indicated she wants additional time and effort devoted to Emergency Management in FY24

 - Recently met Columbia Univ. Center for Safety and Injury Prevention; program helped tribes in the Western U.S. and they are seeking to do the same in eastern U.S.

- Phoenix Area IP is wrapping up evaluation of gun safe pilot project
 - The IP Team may partner with behavioral health to expand to a few more communities
 - Rob will submit presentation abstract to SAVIR (April 2024)
- Phoenix Area IP staff using National Digital Check Form at CPS check-up events
 - So far so good
 - Connectivity issues in remote locations are a barrier at times

 - i. Establishment Type definition refinement
 - Background
 - Most of these revolve around language that doesn't properly differentiate between establishments of varying size, scope and complexity, as well as work-day factors that are not properly aligned with the establishment type or lacking descriptions of establishment characteristics that have contributed to a misalignment of facilities in WebEHRS
 - Methodology
 - Similar to what we did in 2019 when significant efforts made to update definitions
 - Consulted resources like the Model Aquatic Health Code, reviewing common establishment nomenclature used by several state and local health departments, etc.

Healthy Environments = Healthy People

- Establishment Type 46.1 Grocery/C-Store
 - Issue(s): current definition lacks specificity of what is and what is not a grocery/c-store; departments w/in grocery stores are not considered independent of parent facility (i.e. bakeries, meat markets, and delis); misaligned establishments; inflates representative work load for separate departments within grocery stores.
 - Proposed solution: tighten definition to better describe establishment characteristics and create new establishment type 46.2 Grocery-based Bakery, Meat Market, and Delicatessens.
 - Next steps

 - Request input/feedback by 27 NOV
 - Finalize changes during meeting on 29 NOV
- Establishment Type 55 Aquatic Facilities
 - Issue(s): current definition does not account for establishments of varying size, scope and complexity; inflates representative work load for basic aquatic facilities.
 - Proposed solution: create 3 new establishment type(s) based on # of aquatic venues co-located on same property.
