Build capacity to address injuries and violence for American Indian and Alaska Native people through community-driven, culturally centered approaches

Key dates	Application deadline: <b>November 13, 2025</b> Award date: <b>January 1, 2026</b>
Key Information	<p>TIPCAP recipients will be funded per year for 5 years. Eligible applicants will only be issued one award, either for Part I or Part II.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Part I: Up to \$150,000 per year (~ 15 awards)</li><li>• Part II: Up to \$40,000 per year (~ 12 awards)</li></ul>
Who can apply?	<p>Federally recognized American Indian or Alaska Native Tribes, Tribal organizations, and Urban Indian organizations. Part I recipients must have a 2,500 minimum IHS user population.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Part I recipients are funded to hire a full-time injury prevention coordinator to develop an injury prevention program.</li><li>○ Part II recipients are funded to develop injury prevention projects.</li></ul>
