Dear Tribal Leaders and Behavioral Health Coordinators:

The Indian Health Service (IHS), the Center for Substance Abuse Treatment (CSAT), the Center for Substance Abuse Prevention (CSAP), and the Center for Mental Health Services (CMHS) of the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) invite you to attend the third annual IHS/SAMHSA Behavioral Health Conference on Alcohol, Substance Abuse, and Mental Health to be held June 27-30,2005, in San Diego, California. This conference, titled "Weaving Visions for a Healthy Future," will be held in conjunction with the annual IHS Behavioral Health Conference. I am pleased that CSAT, CSAP, and CMHS have committed to ensure the participation of State prevention and treatment officials from each of the 35 reservation States.
