



Indian Health Service 2024 Agency Work Plan

The Indian Health Service's mission is "to raise the physical, mental, social, and spiritual health of American Indians and Alaska Natives to the highest level."

IHS remains committed to mitigating programmatic and operational risks before they arise. The agency is also increasing its efforts to effectively communicate with Tribal and Urban Indian Organization partners on creating and establishing sustainable actions to strengthen the Indian health system. IHS is strengthening the system by developing and implementing a work plan to identify, assess, plan for, and monitor organizational and programmatic risks that impact the agency.

IHS will lean on input from key stakeholders to identify the root causes of ongoing challenges, complete an environmental scan of current activities and identify resources needed to implement sustainable actions. As the work plan is implemented, IHS will publicly share performance measures, timeframes, and impact.
