3	Scene safety to protect from blood born pathogens include		
	wearing gloves and avoiding needles or other drug paraphernalia		
4	Support breathing giving 2 rescue breaths than 1 every 5 seconds		
	for 1 minute		
5	Naloxone can be given to anyone include children, infants, and		
	pregnant women safely		
6	5 Narcan is a nasal spray that contains 4mg of Naloxone		
7	Take Naloxone out of the box and the peel back the top right tab		
	to open		
8	Tilt the person's head back and provide support under the neck		
9	Insert tip of the nozzle into the nostril and press firmly on the		
	plunger to deliver the dose		
10	If doesn't breath normally, give Naloxone every 2-3 minutes by		
	alternating nostrils		
11	Continue providing rescue breaths until independent breathing		
	begins, then put into recovery position		
	Ensure emergency care		
13	Return to an IHS pharmacy to replace naloxone, the Reporting		
	Form will be required if used in an incident
