Overview of Long-Acting Buprenorphine Products for Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) in the United States

In order to support access to individualized medication assisted treatment options for OUD in Indian Country, long-acting formulations of buprenorphine have been added to the <u>IHS National Core Formulary</u>. The Sublocade product is available to order through McKesson 3 days after required REMs enrollment from the ordering facility.

Sublocade REMS Requirements

What is the SUBLOCADE REMS (Risk Evaluation and Mitigation Strategy) Program?

A REMS is a strategy to manage known or potential risks associated with a drug, and is required by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to ensure that the benefits of the drug outweigh its risks. **Sublocade is intended for abdominal subcutaneous injection only by a healthcare provider.** Sublocade is available only through a restricted distribution program called the SUBLOCADE REMS Program because of **the risk of serious harm or death that could result from intravenous self-administration**.

How do healthcare settings and pharmacies receive and store sublocade?

- 1. Be certified in the SUBLOCADE REMS Program.
- Designate an "authorized representative" to complete the SUBLOCADE REMS Program <u>Healthcare</u> <u>Setting and Pharmacy Enrollment Form</u> and submit it to the SUBLOCADE REMS Program for certification.

 - **Important Note**: For DEA number enter <u>facility DEA</u> and NOT provider DEA
- 3. Establish processes and procedures to verify that sublocade is dispensed directly to a healthcare provider. **Sublocade should never be dispensed directly to a patient**.
- 4. Train staff involved in the dispensing of sublocade, to ensure that it is dispensed directly to a healthcare provider.

How should Sublocade be stored?

Store refrigerated. Once outside the refrigerator, this product may be stored in its original packaging at room temperature for up to seven (7) days prior to administration. Discard if left at room temperature for longer than 7 days.
