# **SDPI History**

- In response to rising rates of diabetes in AI/AN people, Congress established SDPI through the Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (P.L. 105-33)
  - "The Secretary shall make grants for providing services for the prevention and treatment of diabetes..." (42 USC 254c-3)



### **SDPI Overview**

- Today SDPI provides funds to 310 I/T/U grant programs in 35 states for diabetes prevention and treatment
  - Tribal 264
  - Urban 31
  - IHS 15



### **Two SDPIs**

- SDPI—302 grantees
  - Starting year 2 (of 5) in grant cycle.
  - Grantees have been fully funded until June 30, 2024
  - Additional funding for 2024 will be based on Congressional reauthorization.
- SDPI-2– 8 grantees
  - Starting year 1 (of 4) in grant cycle
  - Grantees have been fully funded for 2024.



In response to the diabetes epidemic among American Indians and Alaska Natives, Congress established the SDPI grant programs in 1997. The \$150 million annual grant program, coordinated by <u>IHS Division of Diabetes</u> with guidance from the <u>Tribal Leaders Diabetes Committee</u>, provides funds for diabetes treatment and prevention to IHS, Tribal, and Urban Indian health programs across the United States.
