# About 2023 Application Process

- Open to ALL eligible applicants.
- Applications must be submitted by the due date of October 7, 2022.
- Grant regulations do not allow revisions after the due date.
- Applications that are incomplete, of insufficient quality, and/or late will not be awarded SDPI funds.
- Applications will be reviewed by an Objective Review Committee (ORC).
- Funds will be awarded to ALL applicants who successfully meet application criteria and achieve a fundable score.

# Become a Reviewer!

- All SDPI 2023 grant applications that meet the eligibility criteria shall be reviewed for merit by the ORC based on the evaluation criteria.
- It's important to have SDPI grantees involved in the ORC process serving as peer grant application reviewers.
- If you are interested in serving as a grant application reviewer for SDPI, submit your information and indicate your interest and qualifications using this form: <http://new.grantreviewinfo.net/content/IHS-potential-grant-reviewer-form>
  - Make sure to include “SDPI” under Funding Opportunities you are interested in reviewing.

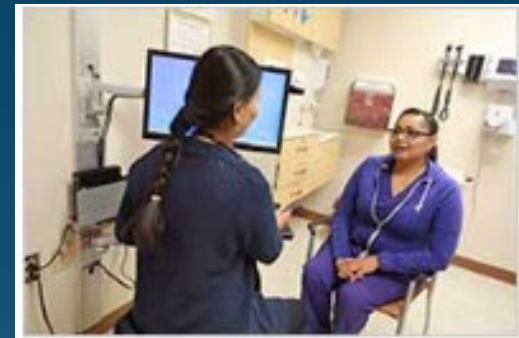
