About 2023 Application Process

- Open to ALL eligible applicants.
- Applications must be submitted by the due date of October 7, 2022.
- Grant regulations do not allow revisions after the due date.
- Applications that are incomplete, of insufficient quality, and/or late will not be awarded SDPI funds.
- Applications will be reviewed by an Objective Review Committee (ORC).
- Funds will be awarded to ALL applicants who successfully meet application criteria and achieve a fundable score.

- 1. Read entire <u>NOFO</u> first
 - Pay particular attention to:
 - <u>Eligibility</u>
 - Evaluation Criteria
- 2. Review the application package from Grants.gov
- 3. Use the templates and resources provided on the <u>2023</u> <u>SDPI Application webpage</u>

- Application submission for 2023 will be via Grants.gov instead of GrantSolutions.gov

Become a Reviewer!

- All SDPI 2023 grant applications that meet the eligibility criteria shall be reviewed for merit by the ORC based on the evaluation criteria.
- It's important to have SDPI grantees involved in the ORC process serving as peer grant application reviewers.
