### **SDPI Overview**

- In response to rising rates of diabetes in AI/AN people, Congress established SDPI in the Balanced Budget Act of 1997 (P.L. 105-33)
  - "The Secretary shall make grants for providing services for the prevention and treatment of diabetes..." (42 USC 254c-3)
- Today SDPI provides funds to 301 I/T/U grant programs in 35 states for diabetes prevention and treatment
  - Tribal 232 (+21 sub-grantees)
  - Urban 29
  - IHS 13 (+5 sub-grantees)

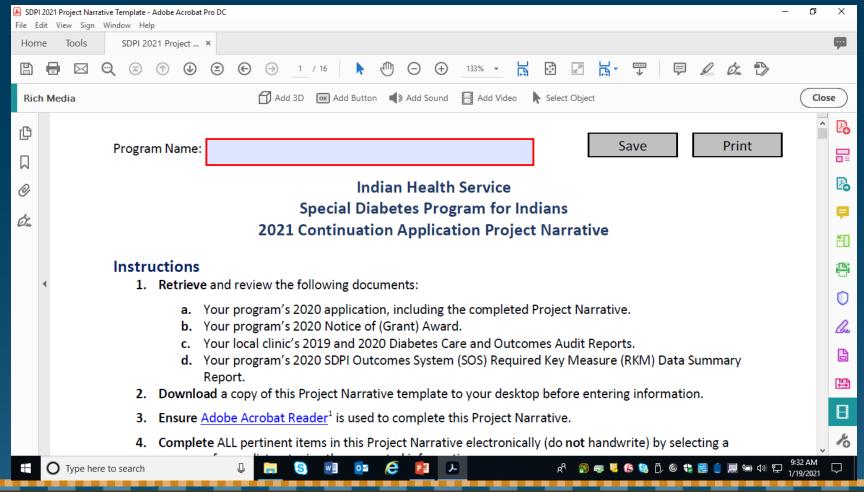

Per the Terms and Conditions, grantees must submit data for the RKM of their selected Best Practice into the SOS at the start (baseline) and end of each budget period. All grantees should have already submitted baseline RKM data for 2020 and must do so before submitting a 2021 Continuation Application. # Required Key Measure (RKM)

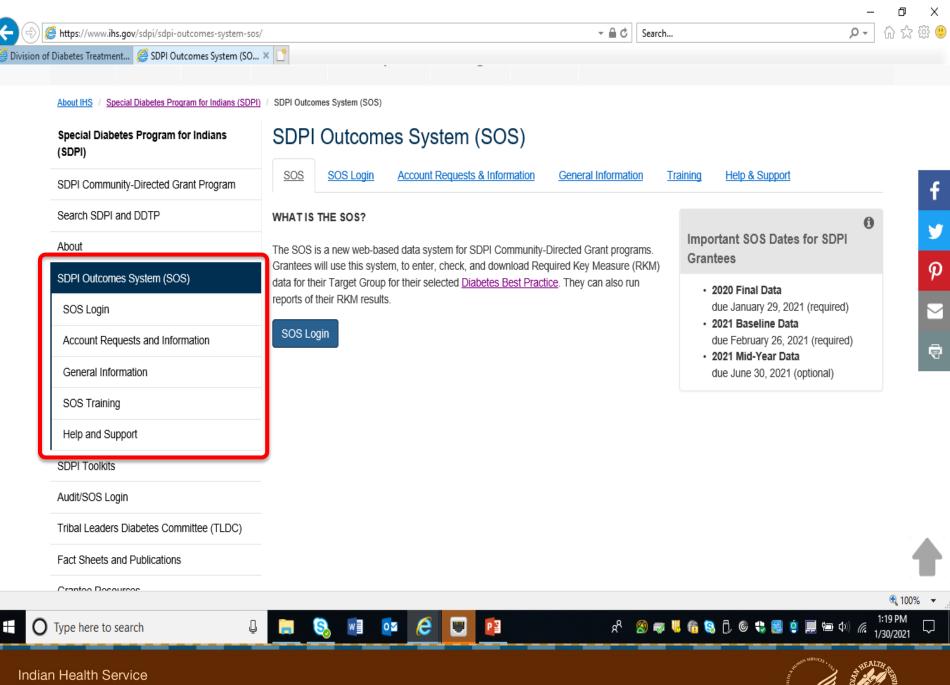
Topic	Importance	Required Key Measure
Tobacco Use Screening	Commercial tobacco use increases the risk of cardiovascular disease, microvascular complications, and premature death. Cessation of tobacco use reduces the risk of stroke and heart attack. Screening for tobacco use in people with diabetes helps programs connect patients/participants with tobacco cessation interventions.	Number and percent of individuals in your Target Group who are screened for tobacco use.

DDTP develops, documents, and sustains clinical and public health efforts to treat and prevent diabetes in American Indians and Alaska Natives.



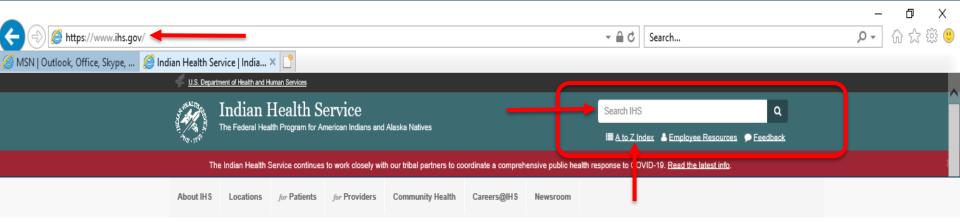
DGM

DGM manages the business aspect of your grant including content of the standard forms, grants policy, and GrantSolutions.

















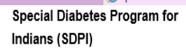

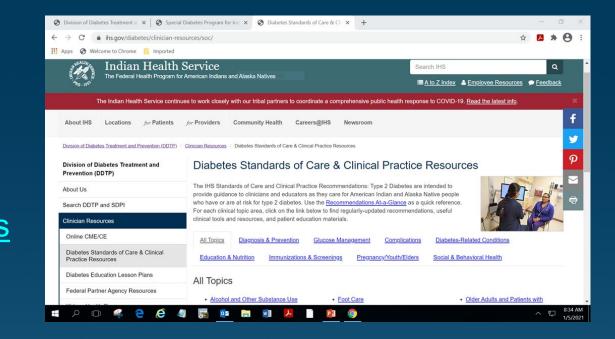

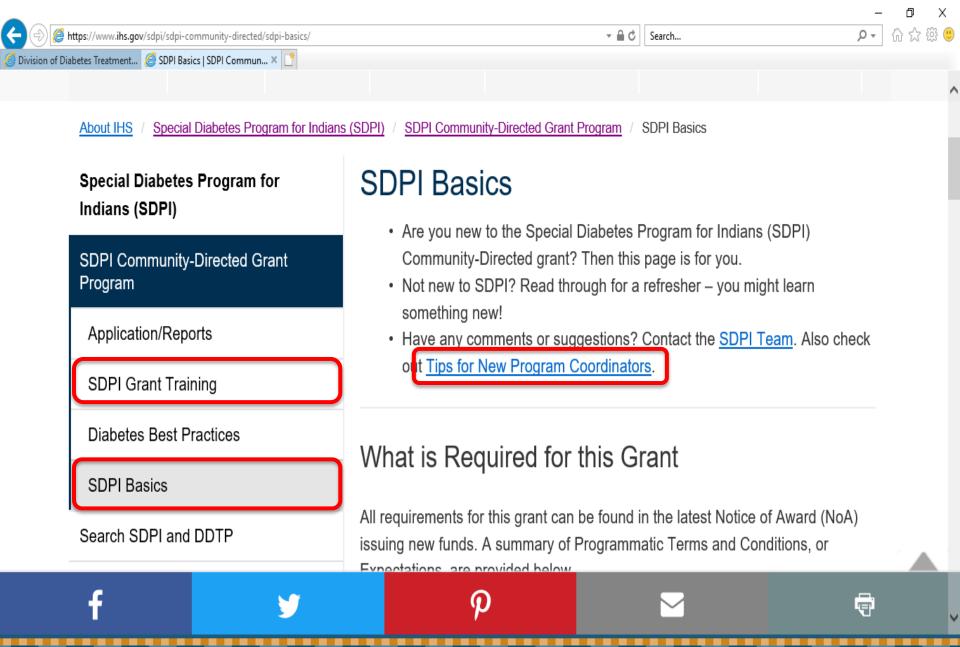
