- Ensure that our work is transparent, accountable, fair, and inclusive



Fair Labor Standards Act Update

- Settlement reached with unions
 - Unpaid/underpaid overtime in federally operated hospitals and clinics
- Improving time/attendance and pay/overtime issues
- IHS will pay up to \$80 million



Proposed Budget 2016

- **\$5.1 billion** overall with **\$461 million (9.9%)** over FY 2015

Some of the increases are:

- Medical inflation, population growth, and IHS/tribal pay costs
- Purchased/Referred Care program
- Behavioral Health for Native Youth initiative (Gen I)
- Fully fund the estimated CSC for FY 2016
- Health care facilities construction, maintenance/improvement, and sanitation facility construction



Affordable Care Act

- Special enrollment periods
- Enrollment activities
- Education and outreach
- Increased third-party collections



Helping Patients Enroll

- Enrolling in Marketplace plans
- Medicaid and CHIP enrollment
- Helping patients with new insurance understand how to use it and encouraging them to re-enroll



Medicare-Like Rates

- Working to extend Medicare-Like rates to physician and non-hospital based services
- Medicare-Like rates are generally lower
- More funding for referrals

- Office of Human Resources
- Veterans Hiring Initiative
- Recruitment and Retention
 - Scholarship and Loan Repayment Programs
 - Extern Program
 - NHSC Partnership



Improving Human Resources Management

- Waiver process for relocation expenses < GS-13
- Title 38 Physician and Dentist Pay
 - ✓ Increase to pay table maximums effective 11/2014
 - ✓ IHS delegated approval authority increased from 250K to 275K
 - ✓ Biennial review conducted
- Increased availability of online training and resources – FLSA, timekeeping, ethics, etc.



Health Information Technology

- Expanding capabilities of RPMS
- Centralizing clinical measurements
- Developing a plan to incorporate GPRA data from non-RPMS Electronic Health Records

Health Information Technology

- Meaningful Use
- RPMS enhancements
 - Deployment ongoing

Health Information Technology

- Enhancements improve care coordination
- ICD-10 Implementation
 - All staff must help prepare for the transition
 - Contingency plans must be developed

Special Diabetes Program for Indians

- Funded at \$150 million per year
- New funding opportunity announcement and competitive grants process
- National Tribal Consultation and Urban Confer input received

Improving Patient Care (IPC) Program

- IPC5 concludes June 30 with 43 teams
 - Teams welcomed into QILN
- IPC 2.0 On-boarding Call – **July 1**
 - New graphics
 - New Change Package
 - Officially launch the new program elements
 - Stronger focus on PCMH transformation
 - New IST role

Hospital Consortium

- New Director – Mr. Chris Mandregan
 - OCPS will support with Executive Staff
- Accreditation
 - Review, analyze, and coordinate survey results
 - 2014 reviews pending
- Reduction of avoidable readmissions/
hospital acquired conditions
 - Continue work from Partnership for Patients

Hospital Consortium

- National Quality Strategy
 - 9 Working Groups aligned with strategy
 - Credentialing, accreditation, customer service, patient advocacy, culture of safety, environment of care, and CMS QIO/QIN engagement
 - New items are hand hygiene, health care worker immunization, and infection control

- Zero Suicide Initiative

Behavioral Health

- MSPI and DVPI
- Generation Indigenous Support
 - FY 2016 President's Budget includes \$25 to expand MSPI with a youth focus
 - Youth Steering Committees
 - Pathways Program

Breastfeeding Promotion and Support

- All 13 obstetric facilities are Baby-Friendly
- Breastfeeding is still an agency priority
- Benefits mothers and children

Government Performance and Results Act (GPRA)

- GPRA year end on June 30
- Of the 23 clinical GPRA measures:
 - 3 exceeded the 2015 targets
 - 10 within range of meeting targets
 - 9 not within range of meeting targets
