Description:

This webinar will review current overdose trends affecting youth and outline practical field management strategies. Participants will examine clinical presentation differences among substance categories, updated naloxone protocols, monitoring requirements, and referral pathways that support connection to treatment and prevention services.

Outcomes/Objectives:

1. Identify emerging youth substance use patterns and describe their implications for EMS response.
2. Demonstrate correct overdose recognition and naloxone administration according to evidence-based protocols.
3. Develop a post-overdose referral and coordination plan that includes validated resources or follow-up services.

Jeremiah D. Simmons, PhD, is a licensed clinical psychologist and Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the University of New Mexico Health Sciences Center. He provides clinical services, supervision, and training through the Division of Community Behavioral Health, with a focus on rural and tribal communities. He has extensive experience working with adolescents and adults with co-occurring mental health and substance use disorders in community behavioral health and integrated care settings. In his clinical practice, he utilizes the ASAM multidimensional assessment framework to guide clinical decision making, level-of-care determinations, and treatment planning. His work integrates evidence-based practices such as Motivational Interviewing and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy with culturally responsive approaches to care.
