Description:

This webinar will review clinical pearls for treating hospitalized patients with opioid use disorder. The webinar will cover the diagnosis of opioid use disorder and withdrawal in hospitalized patients, the management of opioid withdrawal in patients with common medical and substance use disorder co-morbidities, and principles of treating opioid use disorder and withdrawal in hospitalized patients with acute pain and in those awaiting surgery.

Outcomes/Objectives:

1. Identify opioid use disorder and withdrawal in hospitalized patients.
2. Recognize common medical and substance use disorder co-morbidities in hospitalized patients with opioid use disorder and how to manage opioid withdrawal in such settings.
3. Appropriately manage hospitalized patients with opioid use disorder experiencing acute pain or undergoing surgery.

Elizabeth Hoffman, MD is a Clinical Instructor in the Departments of Internal Medicine and Psychiatry at the University of Michigan. She completed a combined residency in Internal Medicine and Psychiatry at Duke University Hospital in 2021. She currently splits her time between Hospital Medicine, Consultation and Liaison Psychiatry, and Addiction Medicine at Michigan Medicine. Dr. Hoffman recently spoke to the Michigan Society of Hospital Medicine on safe prescribing of opioids in the inpatient setting, and has a passion for reducing iatrogenic-induced opioid dependence, morbidity and mortality. She is working to improve quality of care for patients with mental health and substance use disorders both in and out of the hospital.



Colin Smith, MD, MScGH is an Internist-Psychiatrist with the Indian Health Service at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center and a Lieutenant Commander in the United States Public Health Service Commissioned Corps. He serves as faculty for the UC Irvine School of Medicine TNT PCP Fellowship, affiliate faculty member at the Duke Hubert-Yeargan Center for Global Health, and Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Science. Dr. Smith earned a medical degree from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences and a master's in global health from the Duke University Graduate School. He completed a combined Global Health, Internal Medicine and Psychiatry residency at Duke University Hospital. Dr. Smith's research has focused on identifying and addressing racial inequities in health. He earned a Laughlin Fellowship (2022) by the American College of Psychiatrists and the Martin Fenton Award (2021) from the Association of Medicine and Psychiatry.
