Description:

It is critical that health care staff understand the role of palliative care and hospice in American Indian and Alaska Native People (AI/AN). We will explore culturally centered approaches in palliative care, especially in addressing pain. We will discuss ways to recognize signs and symptoms of pain with serious illness and at the end of life including ways to help patients manage pain while transitioning from inpatient to outpatient settings. We will also explore different situations where alternative routes for pain medication administration may be needed. In addition, we will discuss palliative care pain management approaches for patients facing substance use disorder and strategies for harm reduction while providing wholistic, compassionate care.

Outcomes/Objectives:

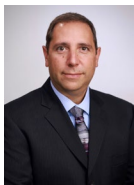
1. Examine and differentiate the roles of Palliative Care and Hospice Care.
2. Explore cultural considerations related to palliative care and end of life care for AI/AN.
3. Recognize signs and symptoms of pain in patients with serious illness and at the end of life.
4. Incorporate palliative care pain management strategies when transitioning from inpatient to outpatient settings.
5. Determine appropriate alternative routes for pain medication administration.
6. Identify harm reduction strategies for palliative care pain management with patients facing substance use disorder.

About the Presenters

Dr. Piromalli is a family medicine physician with a certificate of additional qualification in Hospice and Palliative Medicine. Dr. Piromalli served in the Indian Health Service as a full scope family physician and Director of Palliative Care in Zuni, NM. As a palliative medicine physician, he has served as the Palliative Care Medical Director at the Alaska Native Medical Center providing palliative care support across the Alaska Tribal Health System. He currently provides palliative medicine support at Southcentral Foundation as an integrative consultant with a vision to expand primary palliative care across Alaska Native communities. In addition, he is an Associate Professor within the Division of Palliative Medicine at the University of New Mexico serving as the Director of the New Mexico Palliative Care ECHO Program and Global Palliative Care ECHO Partnership.



Catherine Arnatt, PharmD, MS, BCPP, is an integrated clinical pharmacist at the Anchorage Native Primary Care Center with the Southcentral Foundation (SCF)/Alaska Native Medical Center (ANMC) and an officer with the US Public Health Service. She received her Doctorate of Pharmacy from Virginia Commonwealth University's Medical College of Virginia. She holds a Master of Science in Human Services Management, with an emphasis in Applied Behavior Analysis, and a Bachelor's degree in Psychology with a minor in Sociology. She is Board Certified in Psychiatric Pharmacy, and acts as a Subject matter expert on Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) and chronic pain management. She has held positions with behavioral health and special education programs serving children and adults with developmental disabilities and mental illness, non-profit long-term care, outpatient clinics, and public-school settings.
